



# **Emerald Ash Borer is Here!**

- It first appeared in the U.S. in Michigan in 2002
- It was first identified in Wisconsin in 2008 in Washington County
- Now has been found in 21 Wisconsin counties



# **Overview Of EAB Impacts**

#### Why Is EAB Important?

- There are 839 million ash trees in Wisconsin (about 5 million are urban municipal trees)
- In most Wisconsin communities 20-30% of the MUNICIPAL trees are ash
- Overwhelms community staff and budgets
- Effects On Communities and Property Values
  - Trees have value
  - Tree services loss
  - Environmental loss
  - Why tree replacement is needed

# Planning for EAB and Tree Management

- Planning is Critical!
  - Dane County was 1<sup>st</sup> in WI to develop an EAB Response/Wood Utilization Plan
  - Plan available on Dane County Parks website under 'Notices'
- DNR Urban Forestry can assist municipalities with planning for EAB
  - Community EAB response plan examples
    - Madison, Middleton, Fitchburg-see these community websites
- Management Options
  - Tree Inventory
  - Proactive removal and replacement
  - Treatment
  - Post-infestation removal and replacement
  - Combinations of the above



# Costs

#### Example Costs to Remove Ash Trees

- A crew of 3 can remove 3 24" caliper trees/day; out-sourced cost with crew of 3, bucket truck and chipper ≈ \$2000-\$3000/day for LIVE trees
- Fitchburg has ≈ 780 ash trees, Madison 21,000, Middleton 2600

#### Costs to replace trees

- 2.5"-3.5" caliper trees ≈ \$250-\$350
- Tree diversity in replacements

#### Treatment Options:

- No silver bullet. Treatments must be repeated every one-three years depending on product
- Treatments may be used to slow the wave of tree death and the associated removal and replacement costs
- Costs \$8-\$15 per caliper inch to treat



## **Wood Utilization**

- Wood utilization is the process of moving, storing and using wood from affected trees in a responsible manner that doesn't spread the problem
- Dane County Parks has a planning grant cost-share program (PARC) to help municipalities.
